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Know Your Enemy! This is my most useful tool. Track what the competition is doing and use it as a quick reference when making mid-draft decisions. You can just make an X in the appropriate box, or write out the player's name and/or team. When you know their current roster, you can anticipate their coming picks and get in a few steals and some great values. This is particularly helpful when you're drafting near the front or back of the round(near the corners). [If you feel it's time to draft a QB, but the two guys picking after you already have one, the guy you want is likely to slip back down to you. Or if one doesn't have a QB yet, you better jump on the guy you want now.]
